Like any construction project, building up your family spiritually requires five essential elements: 1. VISION: Share the big-picture "As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD. *Joshua 24:15b* 2. SUPERVISION: Give the gift of your \_\_\_\_\_ Fathers, **do not exasperate** your children. Instead, bring them up in the nurture and instruction of the Lord. Ephesians 6:4 Teach these things to your children, talking about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Deuteronomy 11:19 3. DIRECTION: Teach God's Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it. Proverbs 22:6 Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. Galatians 6:7 Do not be misled: Bad company corrupts good character. 1 Corinthians 15:3 4. MOTIVATION: Spread a Therefore **encourage** one another and **build each other up**, just as in fact you are doing. 1 Thessalonians 5:11 Fathers, do not embitter your children, or they will become discouraged. Colossians 3:21

Monday
Read Deuteronomy 11:17–19. In these verses, the Israelites are told to communicate their mission to their children. How are they told to do this?
How is it possible to do this?
How does a sense of godly purpose help a child navigate the storms of life?

How would you tell a child about their purpose?
Thank God that He made you for a purpose! Ask Him for the ability to communicate to others that they have a purpose too!
Tuesday
Read Ephesians 6:1–4. As Rene mentioned last weekend, the top cause of frustration in children is perceived inaccessibility of parents. How accessible are you to the children in your life?
How can you help children perceive you as more accessible? Have you communicated to them recently your love for them?

Thank the Lord for His nurture of you. Ask Him for wisdom to nurture the children

Wednesday

Read Galatians 6:7–9. What is the point of these verses? Why is it essential to communicate this truth to children?

What are some ways parents can teach the idea of "cause-and-effect" behavior?

How does this change as children grow older?

Ask God to help you sow what you would like to reap later in life — and to teach the same principle to others! Thank Him for His mercy and love!

## **Thursday**

Read 1 Thessalonians 5:11–18 and Ephesians 4:29. These are just two of many Bible passages about building others up. How can words "build up" others?

Today look for at least five opportunities to use your words to build others up. Be specific as you encourage them.

Thank God for the way His words in the Bible build us up! Ask Him to help you have a positive impact on those you meet today.

## <u>Friday</u>

Read Luke 15:11–32. Jesus told this parable to show the kind of Father that God is to us. What principles about parenting come through?

Why is it difficult to stay positive through the parenting years?

Is your attitude toward your children a "healing" attitude or a destructive attitude?

Thank God for His parenting example — especially for the fact that, although every one of His children is a rebel, He remains gracious and loving!
