Monday

Please read Isaiah 55:8. What did you learn in last weekend's sermon about the truth of this verse? How have you seen that in your own life?

Thank God today that He works in all circumstances. Thank Him for the peace He gives. Talk to Him about your struggles to see His blessings in your life.

Tuesday

Please read Matthew 1:18. Put yourself in Joseph's shoes today. To say that his plans were interrupted is quite an understatement!

Sometimes getting our plans interrupted is simply annoying and other times it puts us in a crisis. How do you typically respond to interruptions?

How have you seen God use simple interruptions in your life? How have you seen Him use a major interruption?

Thank God today that interruptions can have meaning. Pray that as you encounter interruptions of all types you'll have a "looking for God" attitude.

Wednesday

Please read Matthew 1:19–23. Isn't it interesting that while Joseph and Mary's lives were being interrupted, the prayer of hundreds of years was about to be answered for the whole nation of Israel!

Write down one thing you've prayed years for. What do you think went through Joseph's mind as he waited for Jesus to be born?

What temptations do you face when you're waiting for God to answer prayer?

How have you seen God grow you while you we're waiting?

Thank God today for His love for you and His plan for you. Talk to God about your struggles with His timing. Pray for faith to trust Him and joy while you wait.

Thursday

Happy Thanksgiving! Please read Psalm 136 today.

Take some time today to write down 10 things you are thankful for and then spend time in prayer thanking God for those blessings.

Friday

Please read Matthew 1:24–25. What have you learned about Joseph's character this week? How does this encourage or challenge you?

Think about an area of your life where you're waiting right now. How is this wait testing your obedience?

How do you think your obedience in waiting demonstrates God's grace? Is there a situation where God is also asking you to extend grace?

Thank God for not only saving you by grace, but also for sustaining you by *His grace every day…including today!*

Saturday
