Today ask God to help you see if you're relying on props like financial success, strength, education, status, or anything else to give you a sense of value. Ask Him to help you value knowledge of God more than anything!

## **FRIDAY**

Read Proverbs 2:1–5. What does it mean to search for something as you search for treasure? How does this apply to your study of God?

Ask God to help you get to know Him better! Spend time praying for our church-wide 50-day study of the attributes of God, that He would use it in amazing ways that glorify Him!

# **SATURDAY**

Today, go back over the notes from Sunday. Read the verses about the ways God reveals Himself. Spend time today looking for God to reveal Himself through creation, the Bible, and Jesus Christ!
