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### The Plot

They could find no corruption in him, because he was trustworthy and neither corrupt nor negligent. Daniel 6:4b

# Three Choices That Create Courage

### 1. Choose over

Now when Daniel learned that the decree had been published, he went home to his upstairs room where **the windows opened** toward Jerusalem... he prayed... Daniel 6:10a

### 2. Choose

Discipline yourself for the purpose of godliness. 1 Timothy 4:7b NASB

Keep yourself in training for a godly life. 1 Timothy 4:7b GN

Spend your time and energy in the exercise of keeping spiritually fit. 1 Timothy 4:7b LB

### Develop

Three times a day he got down on his knees and prayed, giving thanks to his God, just as he had done before. Daniel 6:10b NV

In view of God's mercy... offer your bodies as living sacrifices... be transformed by the **renewing of your mind**... Romans 12:1–2 NV



**3. Choose over** But even if he does not, we want you to know, O king, that we will not serve your gods... Daniel 3:18 NV

# **Daily Meditations**

Some questions adapted from Pursuing Integrity by Kevin and Sherry Harney, and Daniel: Spiritual Living in a Secular World by Douglas Connelly

### Monday

Read Daniel 6:1–28. Look back over your message notes. What do you learn about Daniel's character, lifestyle, and faith as you read this section?

What were some "big ideas" you brought home from the message that were particularly encouraging to you?

Describe someone you have known whose life exemplifies consistent, godly character, like Daniel:

Ask God to help you have the character of Daniel!

### Tuesday

Read Daniel 6:1–9 In this section, the political leaders first tried to find a flaw in Daniel's character. What did their research turn up?

What are some of today's cultural norms and trends that might prevent you from living with godly convictions?

What good and bad might your enemies notice if they tried to find something to frame you with, as these men did with Daniel?

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If you were being watched like Daniel was being watched, what changes (if any) might vou make in vour lifestvle?

Ask God to help you see what weaknesses He would like to work on in your life then yield yourself to Him! Thank Him for His unconditional love for you!

## Wednesday

Read Daniel 6:10–15. Name some disciplines or habits that help you express your love and devotion to Iesus:

What is a spiritual discipline you have tried to develop, or wanted to get going, in your life, but have found it difficult to maintain? Why?

How could a small group be an encouragement to develop godly disciplines?

Ask God to empower you to develop a plan of action for spiritual growth that suits your life and personality and yet also challenges you.

### Thursday

Read Daniel 6:14–20. How do these verses underscore the impact Daniel's life had on the king?

How has Daniel encouraged you to be a more Christ-like example to those around you?

Ask God to show you people on whom you can have an influence through genuine friendship and consistent faith.

### Friday

Read Daniel 6:25–27. What specific aspects of God's character can you discover in Darius' decree?

Pray this prayer today, specifically relating the truths about God to particular challenges or worries you are facing this week.

## Saturday

Please look back over the message and finish any devotions you may have missed.

Think back over the first six chapters of Daniel. How can the fact that "God holds in his hand all your life and all your ways" (Daniel 5:23) help you in the challenges of your life?
