Please read Ezekiel 18:23 & 33:11. How do you balance the tension between Psalm 73:18–20 and today's verses?

In what way(s) do you feel like one of the bad guys?

What do these verses tell you about God's love for people?

How does that challenge you? How does that encourage you?

Thank God today for His amazing love. Pray that you will view people from His perspective and seek to show the same love and patience.
