Daily Meditations

Monday

Read Psalm 22:1–21. This psalm has two parts; this first half is a cry of despair. Why do you think the psalms model for us, again and again, that we can be totally honest with God when we feel abandoned by Him, or when we feel life is unfair?

Why is that kind of honesty better than any other alternatives?

When have you felt the furthest from God? What has helped you in the past when you have felt this way?

Why do you think Jesus said these exact same words on the cross?

Thank God that He is glad when we are honest with Him. Honestly tell him of your joys and sorrows today. Please pray for the Easter and Good Friday services, that the Good News will be clear!

Tuesday

Read the second half of Psalm 22, verses 22–31. Here the mood changes — it becomes triumphant — almost playful! If the verses in the first half of Psalm 22 describe the suffering of Christ, how do these verses relate to Jesus?

Of the final four application points on page two of the message notes, which do you need particularly to hear at this point in your life? Why?

Thank God that the resurrection and glorification followed the suffering of Christ—and will follow your suffering too, if you trust in Christ! Pray for the Easter services, and pray for opportunities to invite people! Thanks!

Wednesday

Read Matthew 27:41–66. There is so much in these verses that is fascinating! Now that you have read Psalm 22, when you see Jesus quoting the first phrase here, do you think it is a deliberate quotation? What is Jesus' reason for this, in your own words?

Read 2 Corinthians 5:21, and Galatians 3:13. How would you summarize the truth expressed in these verses in a way people today could understand?

At what point in your life did you come to realize that Jesus died for you?

Though we will never fully understand it, we can trust in Christ's finished work on the cross for us! Thank God for that today. Please pray that the Easter services this weekend will be full of joy in what Jesus did.

On the Thursday before Easter, Christians traditionally remember how Jesus washed the disciples' feet at the Last Supper. Read John 13:1–17. What was Jesus teaching when he washed the disciples' feet?

How are we to "do these things", as he says here?

How are you "blessed" if you do these things?

Thank God that we serve One who came not to be served, but to serve. Pray that this attitude will be typical of you, and me, and the other Christians at our church and worldwide. Please pray for the Easter services this weekend, that the gospel will be powerfully presented.
