

The Song of Zechariah

ACT ONE: The Waiting (Luke 1:5-7)

Zechariah and Elizabeth were righteous in the sight of God... but they were childless because Elizabeth was not able to conceive, and they were both very old. Luke 1:6a.7

They were waiting for the Messianic prophecies to be fulfilled, from verses like Genesis 12:2,3; 2 Samuel 7:16; and Malachi 4:2-6.

ACT TWO: The Answer (Luke 1:8-25)

The angel said to him: "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to call him John... And he will go on before the Lord, in the spirit and power of Elijah..." Luke 1:13,17

ACT THREE: The Response (Luke 1:57-79)

His father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied: "Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel,

because he has come to his people and redeemed them...

...And you, my child, will be called a prophet of the Most High;

for you will go on before the Lord to prepare the way for him,

to give his people the knowledge of ${\bf salvation}$

through the forgiveness of their sins,

because of the **tender mercy** of our God..." Luke 1:67-68;76-78a

- 4. Read Luke 1:78-79. Zechariah describes Jesus as the sun breaking at dawn (quoting Malachi 4:2). In what ways is Jesus like the light of the sun to you?
