DEBATING JESUS

ABOUT THE AFTERLIFE

MAY 23 & 24

Then Jesus was approached by some **Sadducees**—religious leaders who say there is no resurrection from the dead. They posed this question: "Teacher, Moses gave us a law that if a man dies, leaving a wife without children, his brother should marry the widow and have a child who will carry on the brother's name. Well, suppose there were seven brothers. The oldest one married and then died without children. So the second brother married the widow, but he also died without children. Then the third brother married her. This continued with all seven of them, and still there were no children. Last of all, the woman also died. So tell us, whose wife will she be in the resurrection?" *Mark 12:19-23 NLT (Refers to Deuteronomy 25:5,6)*

JESUS RESPONDS IN THREE WAYS:

1. REBUKE

Jesus replied, "Your mistake is that you don't know the **Scriptures**, and you don't know the **power of God.**" *Mark 12:24*

ASK: Am I open to the _____ and to the _____?

2. REDIRECTION

“But now, as to whether the dead will be raised—haven’t you ever read about this in the writings of Moses, in the story of the burning bush? Long after Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob had died, God said to Moses, ‘I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.’ So he is the God of the living, not the dead. You have made a serious error.” *Mark 12:26-27*

3. REIMAGINING

“...You don’t know the power of God. For when the dead rise, they will neither marry nor be given in marriage. In this respect they will be like the angels in heaven. *Mark 12:24b-25*

DAILY MEDITATIONS

MONDAY

Read Mark 12:18-27. What point or insight made an impression on you from this weekend’s message or from this text? How is it possible for religious leaders to “not know the Scriptures or the power of God”? How can you better know both? *Ask God to help you this week to know his word and his power better! Thank him that he makes both available to you freely.*

TUESDAY

Read Psalm 16:10,11 and Psalm 49:15. How is it a comfort to know this life is not all there is? How does a genuine belief that there are glories waiting for the believer after death put both good and bad things in this life in perspective? *Thank God that he will not “abandon you to the grave”. Ask him to help you live your life with this in view.*

WEDNESDAY

Read Isaiah 26:19. The Bible does not merely teach that our spirits endure after death; it teaches an actual resurrection of the body and recreation of the physical earth. That’s because God does not abandon his physical creation to sin and only redeem the soul. He redeems all of his universe, both physical and spiritual. How is this better than a merely spiritual afterlife? *Thank God for the promise of resurrection!*

THURSDAY

Read Job 19:26. The Book of Job is one of the earliest books of the Bible. Yet even here there is a hint of the resurrection. Considering the many physical sufferings he endured, how do you think Job was comforted by his belief in a physical – not just spiritual – afterlife? *Jesus was raised from the dead; you will be too! Thank God for this promise.*

FRIDAY

Read a great New Testament passage about the resurrection: 1 Cor. 15:51-58. At the end of this passage, what is Paul’s application? How is his description of what happens after death inspiring to you? *Thank God that death is not the end!*

SATURDAY

To prepare for this weekend’s message, please read Mark 12:18-34. Please pray for the weekend services. Pray that our church grows in the fruit of the Spirit. Thank you!
