**Coline Weeks** - is in rehab at Kindred after knee replacement surgery. Pray for continued recovery.


**Tom Carr, Nancy Shipley and Sue Doxater** - are on Hospice Care. Pray for God's peace and comfort.

## THE BEST SEAT AT THE TABLE

LUKE 7:36-50

APRIL 30 & MAY 1

When one of the Pharisees invited Jesus to have dinner with him, he went to the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table. A woman in that town who lived a sinful life learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, so she came there with an alabaster jar of perfume. As she stood behind him **at his feet** weeping, she began to **wet his feet** with her tears. Then she **wiped them** with her hair, **kissed them** and **poured perfume on them**. When the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would know who is touching him and what kind of woman she is—that she is a sinner." Luke 7:36-39

Jesus answered him, "Simon, I have something to tell you." "Tell me, teacher," he said. "Two people owed money to a certain moneylender. One owed him five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. Neither of them had the money to pay him back, so he forgave the debts of both. **Now which of them will love him more?**" Simon replied, "I suppose the one who had the bigger debt forgiven." "You have judged correctly," Jesus said. Luke 7:40-43

Then he turned toward the woman and said to Simon, "**Do you see this woman?** I came into your house. You did not give me any **water for my feet**, but she **wet my feet** with her tears and **wiped them** with her hair. You did not give me a kiss, but this woman, from the time I entered, has not stopped **kissing my feet**. You did not put oil on my head, but she has **poured perfume on my feet. Therefore, I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven—as her great love has shown. But whoever has been forgiven little loves little.**" Luke 7:44-47

Then Jesus said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." The other guests began to say among themselves, "**Who is this who even forgives sins?**" Jesus said to the woman, "**Your faith has saved you; go in peace.**" Luke 7:48-50

### NOTES:

**DAILY MEDITATIONS** Brief daily readings based on this weekend's message:

**MONDAY** Read Luke 7:36-38. Imagine how shocking this scene must've been! It would be shocking today if someone you didn't invite to dinner showed up and did something like that. Honestly, how do you think you would respond to this woman in the moment? Which of the woman's actions do you find most compelling? *Thank God for the opportunity to study the Bible and learn. Pray for an open heart that reflects God's love for everyone.*

**TUESDAY** Read Luke 7:39-43. With the advantage of hindsight it can be easy to come down on Simon for his critical spirit. How have you been critical of someone whose life appears less together than yours? What do you learn from Jesus' response to Simon? *Talk to God about your struggles with being critical. Ask him for the ability to see people as he sees them and to respond with kindness and not a critical spirit.*

**WEDNESDAY** Read Luke 7:44-48. When Jesus tells Simon the punchline of the story (verse 47) he makes the woman the heroine! A woman hero would've been unusual in Jesus' day, let alone a woman with a sinful reputation. When do you struggle most with offering forgiveness? How have you seen the truth of "whoever has been forgiven little, loves little"? *Ask God for a heart that lavishly forgives others. Pray by name for people you are struggling to forgive.*

**THURSDAY** Read Luke 7:49-50. We can be so accustomed to the idea of Jesus forgiving our sins that it's hard to grasp how shocking this was when he affirmed the woman's complete forgiveness. Think about a time when the forgiveness you have in Jesus really sank in. How did that impact you? What connection have you felt between being forgiven and living with peace? *Thank God for his amazing forgiveness of all of your sins. Pray for a heart that accepts and understands more and more the amazing grace of God.*

**FRIDAY** Re-read Luke 36-46, paying attention to the emphasis on Jesus' feet. What would it look like to spend some time "at the feet" of Jesus? Imagine where those feet were willing to go. Those feet carried Jesus to the Cross. Those feet were pierced... for you. 1 Corinthians 15:25 says, "For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet." How does that make you feel? What kind of perspective does this bring? *Thank God for both the humility and supremacy of Jesus. Bring him both your burdens and your devotion. And be at rest at the feet of the Lord.*

**SATURDAY** Which character in this story do you most identify with and why? Finish any devotions you may have missed and spend some time meditating on the Bible verse for this week. *God thank You that it is faith that has saved me and not my own efforts. Thank You for the peace that comes in knowing that I am forgiven.*
