DAILY MEDITATIONS

Brief daily readings based on this weekend's topic:

MONDAY Review the notes from last weekend. What point or points meant a lot to you? Read James 1:17-18 and Psalm 25. According to these verses, what is God like? How can this help you when you are stressed out over decision-making? What decisions are you anxious about? How can the truths in these verses help you in those decisions? Thank God that He is good, gracious, and clear!

TUESDAY Read James 1:22-25 and Psalm 119:105. According to these verses. what is a great way to understand the will of God? You may be wondering about God's will for your life; here are some passages that lay out God's will: Read James 3:13-18; Ephesians 5:17-18; 1 Thessalonians 4:3-6 and 5:16-18; and Matthew 28:18. What do they say? Thank God for revealing His will about these important areas. Tell Him vou trust in Him and want to be vielded to Him

WEDNESDAY Read Psalm 25 again and Psalm 139:10. Many times God guides us in ways we only perceive when we look back years later. Looking back, how have you seen God guide you in ways you only see in retrospect? Thank God for specific ways He has guided you in retrospect.

THURSDAY Read Matthew 7:7-11. What does Jesus say in these verses that relates to finding the will of God? Do you ever struggle with the idea that God's will is a "dot"-that all the other options must be "Plan B"? What are some of the drawbacks to this approach? How would you support from Scripture the idea that God's will involves our free choice within the framework of His revealed will? Thank God that He wants you to be mature. making choices and learning from them. Ask Him to help your choices be wise ones!

FRIDAY Read James 1:5-8. How will you know if the guidance you think you are receiving from God is truly from Him? Great question! These questions may help: Does it agree with the Bible? Does it make me more like Christ? Does my church family confirm it? Today, ask God for specific area you need guidance about. What is God already telling you through his Word?

SATURDAY Read Psalm 1. What kind of counsel does this Psalm warn against? Do you ever listen to "unwise counsel" from friends or media? Ask God for wisdom to listen only to wise counsel. Please pray for the services this weekend—and for the Acts series this fall!
