### **QUESTIONS** for discussion and meditation:

### **MONDAY**

Look back over the different kinds of friends in your notes. Put a star next to each kind that you have right now. Write the names of those friends on your notes. Now think of ways to honor those friends. Can you thank them? Encourage them with a prayer or note? Do it this week. Spend time thanking God for your friends.

### **TUESDAY**

Look back over that list of friendship types again. Which types do you need, but lack right now? Put a circle next to those. Now pray that God will bring those people into your life, and that your eyes will be open for them. Thank God that Jesus called us his friends! Spend time refocusing on Him today!

### **WEDNESDAY**

Look back over that list of friends one more time! Which type of friend are you? You may be different types to different people. Put an asterisk next to those, and write the names of people to whom you are that kind of friend—or people for whom you would like to be that kind of friend. Pray that God would show you ways to be the right kind of friend to those around you. Again, thank God that Jesus called us his friends!

### **THURSDAY**

Read Exodus 18:14-18. In this story, Moses is super-busy helping people. What does his father-in-law Jethro point out to him? What advice does he give? Do you need to hear this advice? Ask God to help you realize that you can't do it alone, and to bring people into your life that can help you. Pray for eyes to see the options you have for help!

### **FRIDAY**

Read Ecclesiastes 4:9-12. What truths about friendship do you see? Thank God for your friends. Think of a friendship that needs to be restored. Ask God for wisdom and strength to do that. Pray for our services this weekend as we start a new series in Psalms!
