CHASING DAVID

WEEK 1 FINDING CONFIDENCE WHEN REJECTED 1 SAMUEL 16

All verses from the New Living Translation (NLT) unless otherwise noted.

The LORD said to Samuel... "Go to Bethlehem. Find a man named Jesse... for I have selected one of his sons to be my king." 1 Samuel 16:1

When they arrived, Samuel took one look at Eliab and thought, "Surely this is the Lord's anointed!" But the Lord said to Samuel, "Don't judge by his appearance or height, for I have rejected him. The Lord doesn't see things the way you see them. **People judge by outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart**." 1 Samuel 16:6-7

Then Samuel asked, "Are these all the sons you have?" 1 Samuel 16:11a

"No Moabite or any of his descendants may enter the assembly of the LORD, even down to the tenth generation." Deuteronomy 23:3 NIV (David's great-grandmother Ruth was a Moabite)			

And the LORD said, "This is the one; anoint him." 1 Samuel 16:12b

So as David stood there among his brothers, Samuel took the flask of olive oil he had brought and **anointed David with it**. And the **Spirit of the LORD** came powerfully upon David **from that day on**. 1 Samuel 16:13
