Luke 2:1-7

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world... And everyone went to his own town to register. Luke 2:1, 3

Daily Meditations

Monday

Please read Matthew 1:23. This verse is the promise. The promise that generations eagerly desired to see fulfilled – the promise that would change EVERYTHING. However, the promise was given hundreds of years before its fulfillment.

How do you cope with God's seeming silence to His promises? Does your attitude tend towards patience, busyness, making excuses for God, disappointment or something else?

How could looking back on God's fulfillment of this most amazing promise help you in the silent times?

Thank God today for the many promises fulfilled you see in the Bible and in your life! Pray that your faith will rest on God's character and not your feelings.

Juesday

Please read Micah 5:2 & Luke 2:1-5. In the silence, God was working. He orchestrated a journey that Joseph would not likely have undertaken with a very pregnant Mary unless he had to. It probably didn't seem like God was moving to Mary & Joseph, but He was putting them in place to fulfill the promise He made generations earlier.

How does God's work (even through government officials) give you encouragement in the silent times?

Thank God today for His amazing power over life's circumstances. Thank Him for His all-knowing and all-understanding view of your life. Pray for courage to trust His active presence in your life and for eyes to see the ordinary movements as Divine intervention!

Wednesday

Please read Luke 2:6-7. In very simple words, Luke describes the ultimate hinge of human history. The promise is fulfilled in a very ordinary looking baby.

How do you imagine Mary & Joseph were feeling about God's promise to them in that moment?

Recall a time when God did what He promised in your life but it didn't look like you imagined it would? How did that impact your acceptance of the promise fulfilled in the moment? How has your view of that moment changed as you gained the perspective of time?

Thank God today that He knows the best way to fulfill the promises He's made to you. Pray for joy as you experience the fulfillment of promises in His way and time.

Thursday

Please read Isaiah 50:10-11. Verse 11 has long served as a caution for any of us who grows weary of waiting for God and tired of His apparent silence.

When are you most tempted to "light your own fires"?

What does verse 10 say to do when you are struggling with God's silence?

Think of at least one area of your life where you are currently trying to "light your own fire". How will you "trust in the name of the Lord and rely on God" today?

Thank God that He is there in the dark and silence. Pray for the emotional and spiritual strength to choose trust over control today.
