Daily Meditations

Monday

Review the notes from this weekend's message. As you evaluate your life — your priorities, your daily schedule, what keeps you from committing? Do you feel you often fear commitment? If so, why? Read John 8:36. God desires us to overcome — to be free of — this fear of commitment. He reminds us that by his Son we are free, which means freedom from fear.

Thank the Lord that he offers freedom! Thank him that, as you evaluate your life, he is faithful to forgive and help you get back on the right track.

Tuesday

Please read James 1:15. God is **eager** to give you wisdom as you navigate life and commitments. Why is this encouraging to you?

Go on to read James 3:17 as it describes what heavenly wisdom looks like. How is worldly wisdom hurting you? In what areas of your life do you need to specifically ask God for his perfect wisdom? How will you cultivate that?

Lord we praise you that your heavenly wisdom is pure, peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. Thank you for freely giving such great wisdom to us when we ask.

Wednesday

Please read Psalm 37:23–24. The benefit to being a person that is able to commit, by faith, is that the Lord will make his steps firm. That means you can have confidence that, no matter what happens, the Lord is near. As you ponder this scripture, what might be keeping you from committing something in your life to God? What fears are you still holding on to?

Thank God today that he wants to be part of the details of your life. That he sees your timeline, beginning to end. Ask him to grow you as you learn to commit your ways to him.

Thursday

Often as we deal with the uncertainty of life, we have to, by faith, surrender our anxieties to the Lord. Psalm 31:15 reminds us that "my times are in your hands". That means that even though decisions, conditions, or our future may seem uncertain-God is in control. How does this passage of scripture challenge or inspire you as you look to be a person of commitment?

God, I thank you that in your goodness you guide and direct my life — that there is nothing that happens to me or that I go through that you do not already know about. Thank you for leading me through any decision I may face.

Friday

Trusting God can often be easier said than done. Take a minute right now and write down what areas of your life you are easily able to trust God in. Now take another brief minute to write down areas where you struggle trusting the Lord. Please read Proverbs 16:3. What does it mean for the Lord to establish your plans?

Thank the Lord for all he has done already in your life. Thank him also for what you

anticipate him to do in the future as he heals some areas in your life and helps you to become a person of commitment.
