Monday

Think honestly: Is your life driven by commitment — or by circumstances, convenience, or criticism? Please read Daniel 3:1–7. What was most striking to you in the message this weekend? Why?

Thank God today for the example of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. Pray that your dominant life principle will be commitment!

Tuesday

Review the first "crucial question" from the notes. Please read Daniel 3:12. What do you think were Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego's core identities?

What about you: what is your core identity?

Think about your life right now. What trumps everything else right now?

Thank God today for the truth that your core identity is in Him. Pray that you'll grow in courage and conviction.

Wednesday

Please read Daniel 3:16–18. What do you find most encouraging in Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego's courage in this passage?

How does it challenge you?

While you're not probably under threat of being thrown in a literal fire, you may feel the "fires" of various life situations. Are you able to say, "the God I serve is able..."? And "even if he does not..." I choose to serve Him? What would it look like to apply the courage of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego to your life?

Pray that you'll have the same attitude and faith of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego.

Thursday

Please read Daniel 3:24–25. Think again today about the "fires" in your life. How does it encourage you to know that God is with you in those fires today?

What is your obstacle to believing He is with you?

Thank God today that you never stand alone — in good times or bad. Talk to Him about your struggles to believe He is with you. Ask Him to grow your faith.

Friday

Please read Daniel 3:28–30. What was the impact of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego's courage on the king?

We are always influencing people — for good or bad. Think about those closest to you; what visible influence are you having on them? Would they agree with you?
