DAILY MEDITATIONS

MEMORY VERSE: "God saw all that He had made, and it was very good."
Genesis 1:31

MONDAY: Read Genesis 1:20–2:15. Each time God finishes an act of creation, what does he say? If God is creative and caring for his creation, then what will we be like if we are "in his image"? When God "rules", is it a rule of love and just action, or is it a rule characterized by injustice and cruelty? Then what does it mean for us to "rule" creation in His image? *Ask God to help you care and love for all of His creation—including people!*

TUESDAY: Read Psalm 8. How would you describe the attitude of David in this psalm? What does it mean for humans to "rule" over nature? Remember that our example is not some tyrannical human king, but the rule of God. How can you justly "rule" over the little piece of nature that you have influence over—your water, your land, your resources? How can your care for creation be a good witness to those who do not believe? *Ask God to help you live, like David in this psalm, with gratitude and good stewardship, so that you can better spread the good news!*

WEDNESDAY: Read Psalm 19. In verses 1–6, David writes about the "big book" of creation. How does creation "declare the glory of God"? When have you felt close to God in nature? Then in verses 7–14, David writes about the "little book" of God's Word, the Scriptures. How does the Bible work together with creation to bring people a fuller understanding of God's nature? *Thank God that, although we see God's great power in creation, we learn of his great love through Scripture!*

THURSDAY: Read Psalm 104. According to this psalm, what are some of the things that God does for His creation—including us? How do verses like 24–26 help you enjoy God's creation more? How does this help you rejoice in God more? *Express your wonder to God in prayer, as the writer of this psalm did!*

FRIDAY: Read Revelation 21:1–4; 22:1–4. God's plan of salvation isn't just about your soul; it's about all of a creation—about a renewed world! God values the planet so much he includes it in the resurrection and renewal bought by Christ on the cross. What does this imply to you about how you are to regard the world around you? *Thank God that the gospel includes good news for the entire planet!*
