DAILY MEDITATIONS

MEMORY VERSE: "And the Lord's servant must not guarrel; instead, he must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful." 2 Timothy 2:24

MONDAY: What is one topic sure to provoke an argument at your family gatherings? Do you tend to "bait" other people or are you the "peacemaker"? Read 2 Timothy 2:14. What do you think the people in Timothy's church might have been arguing about (see 1 Tim. 1:3-6)? Read through the message notes from this past weekend. What points stood out for you? Ask God to help you defend the faith without being argumentative or unkind.

TUESDAY: Read 2 Timothy 2:15–19. It's easy to be so defensive about the truth that we become guarrelsome; on the other hand, it's easy to avoid confrontation to the point we water down our convictions. Paul warns Timothy against both errors. Did you ever know someone who was great at lovingly and gently expressing firm convictions? What impressed you about that person? Ask God to help you stay strong in the essentials, yet express them with gentleness and kindness to all.

WEDNESDAY: Read 2 Timothy 2:20,21. In the middle of a chapter on avoiding guarrels comes this analogy about plates and cups. Considering Paul has been contrasting Christians who guarrel and "chatter" with steady, gentle Christians who focus on God's Word, what point do you think Paul is making with the clay cups vs. gold cups analogy? Have you ever known a Christian who is like a "gold cup"? How so? Ask God to help you stay above the fray and stay focused on Himto not let people incite you into arguments and controversies, but instead be a person of calm love.

THURSDAY: Read 2 Timothy 2:22-24. What is the main thing Paul seems to be steering Timothy away from here? How is guarreling an "evil desire of youth"? Of the four things Paul tells Timothy to pursue in verse 22, which is easiest for you? Which is most difficult? Ask God to help you stay focused on the grace of God given to you through Christ Jesus. Just as He is gentle to you, be gentle to those who disagree with you.

FRIDAY: Read 2 Tim. 2:25-26. According to these verses, how are we to respond to our opponents? Whose responsibility is it to change peoples' minds (who grants people repentance and knowledge of the truth, according to verse 25)? How does this reminder change the way you converse with people who disagree with your faith? Ask God to always help you remember the power of the Holy Spirit: He is the One who convicts of sin and leads people to repentance, not you!

SATURDAY: Read 2 Timothy 2:14–26 in preparation for this weekend's message. Please pray for the services, that God will work in them in amazing ways! Thanks!
